



COMMENT: The work of the Creativity Group, led by Lene Tanggaard and Vlad Glaveanu has produced a number of internationally highly valued publications, all predicated upon locating the most creative moments in the ordinary lives in everyday contexts. This links directly to the theoretical efforts on hybridizing activity theorires (Theme 1) and is further supported by Luca Tateo's development of new models of imagination processes. CREATIVITY in life and science is built on the basic processes of IMAGINATION as it is linked with MEMORY (studied at the Centre by Brady Wagoner and Ignacio Bresco)

COMMENT: The focus on deep feelings in human life dramas is cross-societally universal and needs both theoretical elaboration and practical implementation of culturally adjusted interventions (plans for establishing an interdisciplinary GRIEF CENTRE). The whole research programme of Svend Brinkmann's on DIAGNOSTIC CULTURES is linked with this theme, which has its international extension in Theme 5

Theme 5: Frictions at borders of cultural histories (GLOBALIZATION AND INTERVENTIONS)

COMMENT: This theme has resulted in Danish-Indian collaboration in the area of looking how DANISH SPECIALISTS ADJUST TO COMPLETELY ALIEN (to them) SOCIAL PRACTICES in India (the ongoing Ph.D. work in India by Sanna Schliewe— finding the phenomena of "moral holiday"). The focus on BORDER PHENOMENA (Pina Marsico) supports this international research with focus on the PROCESSES OF TRANSFORMATION of social norm systems. David Carre's Ph.D. dissertation on the construction of economic realities links with this theme.
